The Big Dance Show

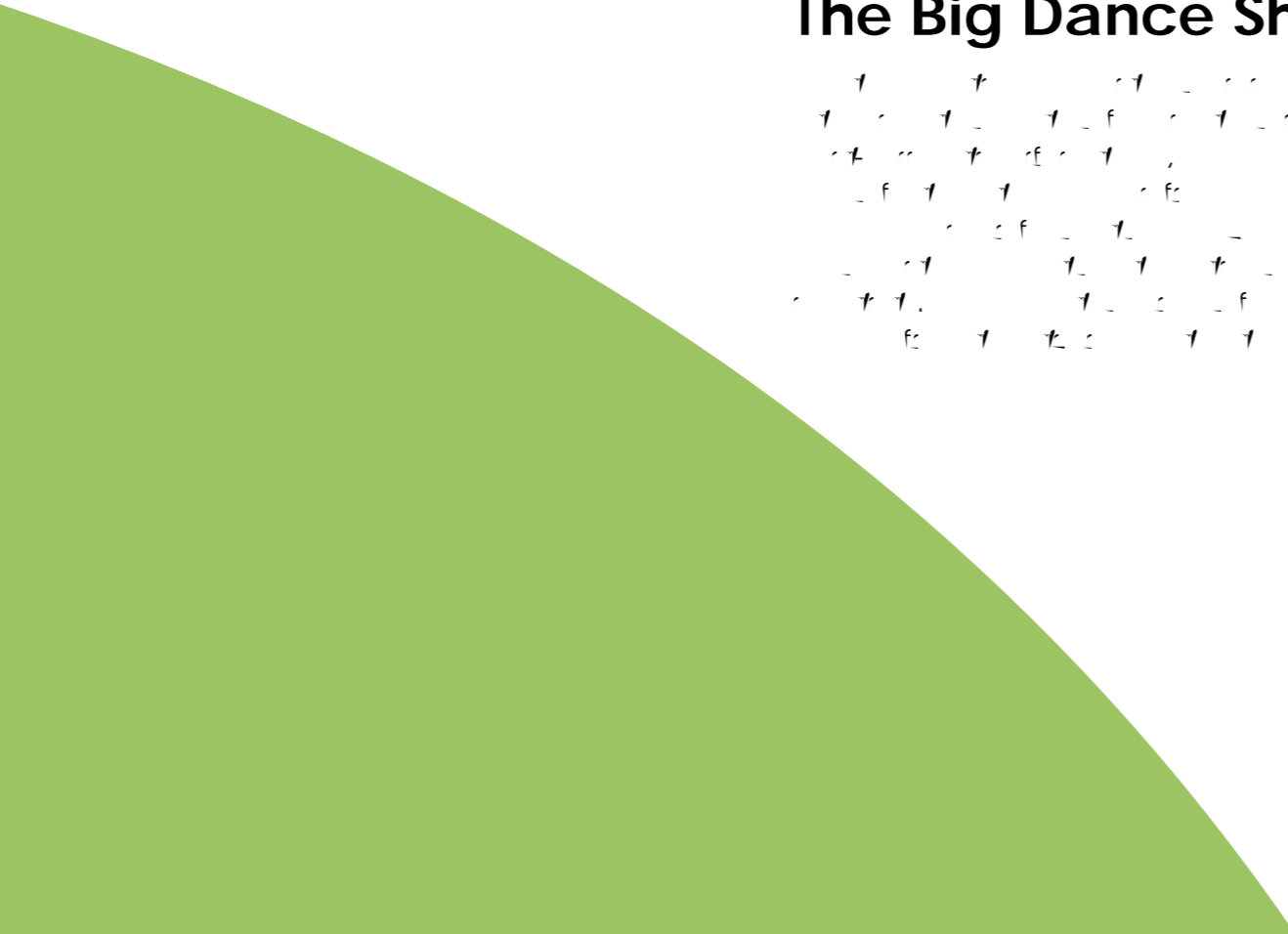
